



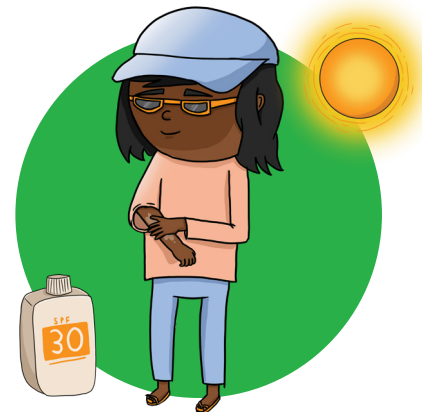
Even our Aboriginal mob can get sunburn

Be careful in the sun especially after a burn

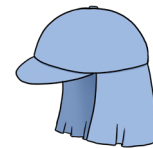
Scars from burns are very sensitive and can get damaged from the sun in less than 15 minutes. Sunburn can change the colour of the scar. Bub may not see or feel this until it is too late.

There is also a risk of skin cancer later in life. Bub must be very careful in the sun for 2 years after the burn.

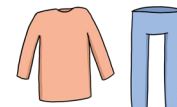
